

How does it work?

1. Open a print account at one of the location

OR: Send an email to kopierer@asta-hsrm.de (leave the subject line blank) and attach all documents to be printed. If no account for the sender's email address exists in the system, the system will automatically create a new account and save the PDF file in this account.

2. Top up your credit

- Top up at the AStA office (KSR or RÜ) OR: Transfer the amount X via PayPal to finanzen@ asta-hsrm.de -> Please specify the subject: Print/ Scan

3. Now you can print, scan, and copy at any time



Kurts garden

Kurt's Garden is the campus garden at the Kurt-Schumacher-Ring campus, which was created by students and the AStA Environmental Department in the spring of 2021. You can find the garden next to Building C, on the way to the daycare center (between Building C and the parking garage). The garden is open to all members of the university and anyone interested in gardening.

The principle behind it – permaculture

The campus garden is based on the principles of permaculture, which involves observing and imitating natural processes. Permaculture is an ecologically sustainable discipline. This method of cultivation does not focus on yield, but rather on careful, sustainable, and natural management. The aim is to achieve an ecological balance on the land, where pests and the decomposition of organic material, for example, are regulated by natural processes.

Our work – your contribution?

Kurt's Garden not only enables you to make contacts, but also offers a place of tranquility between lectures. We enable you to implement creative and sustainable ideas together. The campus garden is also a CCC course. No experience with gardening? No problem, a lot of it is learned by doing. We don't just want to garden here, we also want to get to know each other. 

German Semester ticket

With the AStA Germany semester ticket, you can travel throughout Germany on city and regional buses, trams, subways, local and regional trains (S-Bahn, RB, RE), and regional trains operated by private rail companies (e.g., VIAS, HLB, vlexx).



The Semester ticket fee

The cost of the AStA semester ticket is included in the semester fee (solidarity model). This is the only way that all students can use public transport throughout Germany at such favorable conditions compared to the Deutschland-Ticket.

Refunds are possible in special cases:

- Severely disabled persons (supplementary sheet to the severely disabled person's pass and valid token)
- Semester abroad
- Semester abroad (min. 3 months)
- Double degree (two universities with compulsory purchase of semester ticket)
- Landesticket Hessen (D-Ticket may not be purchased)
- Illness (proportional reimbursement for the months)



validity period

Summer semester: April 1 - September 30 Winter semester: October 1 - March 31

Your ticket is valid only for you; you cannot transfer it to other people or take anyone else with you on the ticket. The ticket is issued as a digital ticket and you can add it to your Apple or Google Wallet app. You will receive the ticket via the link on our website two weeks before the validity period. In exceptional cases, an alternative issue via chip card is possible. You can find more information on our website.

Unfortunately, the AStA semester ticket cannot be used on long-distance trains (IC, EC, ICE). If you are checked and have forgotten your ticket, you can show it within a week and will only have to pay a processing fee.

Whether you want to transport beer crates from A to B or need a car for moving house, you have access to an entire fleet of vehicles from the carsharing provider book-n-drive. At special prices!

Your benefits

- No sign-up fee
- €10.00 starting credit (valid for six months from registration)
- Lower deductible in the event of damage (€300 instead of €1,500)
- Simplified right of termination

There are four different classes (XS, S, M, L). Everything from city runabouts to vans is available. Station-based vehicles must always be returned to the station where you rented them. City runabouts can be opened spontaneously at the roadside without prior booking. The advantage here is that you can also return the car to other city runabout areas, regardless of which city you are in.



Do you need a van to move house? Then just rent one!

Information and prices

You can pick up and return your studibus whenever you want within your booked period. It must always be returned to the place where it was picked up. Unfortunately, one-way rentals are not available.

Rental period

Early, late, or night shift: 25,00€ Day: 35,00€

Price per kilometer

Up to 150 kilometers: 0,27€/km Additional kilometers: 0.17€/km

Fuel allowance

All kilometers: 0,23 €/km

Other

Non-students: + €6.00 Rebooking, cancellation, etc. See price list on the website.

Liability and refueling

Liability for damages is already included in the price. Your liability is limited to €1,500. If the tank is less than 1/4 full before you return the car, you should use the fuel card to fill up the tank for the next renter. This won't cost you anything extra and can be done cashless using the card.

The Transporter

The standard studibus is a Renault Master with a loading capacity of approx. 10 m³. In addition to the driver, there is room for two more people in the cab. To ensure your safety on the road in winter, the vans are equipped with suitable tires.

Nextbike

Rent up to 3 bikes at a time in over 45 cities, as often as you like for up to 60 minutes at a time, free of charge. From the 61st minute onwards, you pay only 1,00€ per half hour (max. 5€/day).

Registration

Register with your student email address: secure.nextbike.net/de/wiesbaden/registrierung/ If you already have a nextbike account, you can send an email to info@nextbike using your student email address and request a change to the "AStA Hochschule RheinMain" tariff, stating your name and customer number. Once you have received the confirmation email, you can start cycling at AStA rates.

Rent a bicycle

Option 1 - Nextbike app:

- 1. Scan the bike's QR code with the app.
- 2. The lock will open automatically.
- 3. Off you go!

Option 2 - Call:

- 1. Call 03069205046 and give your bike number
- 2. The lock will open automatically
- 3. Off you go!



Short break?

For a short stop, you can put the nextbike into parking mode. To do this, open the app and tap on your current rental. Then press "Park" and close the frame lock by pushing it down. When you want to continue riding, you can simply open the lock again using the app.

Please note: The rental time continues to run during the break in your ride.

Return

- 1. Return your nextbike to a station in Wiesbaden or Rüsselsheim marked in the app. In Rüsselsheim, you can also return your bike free of charge to any of the streets marked in blue in the app!
- 2. Press the small lever on the frame lock downwards.
- 3. The end of the rental period will be confirmed in the app.

Finances

We at the AStA also have to pay bills and draw up budgets to finance parties, events, and orientation weeks. This is the job of the finance department, which keeps track of income and expenditure during the current fiscal year. We are monitored and controlled by the Audit Committee of the Hessian Court of Auditors, so that we can prepare the annual financial statements after the end of the fiscal year with the assistance of an auditing firm.

We then work on the budget for the new fiscal year and must ensure that sufficient funds are always available for each area of responsibility of the AStA. In addition, our finance department manages the self-administered funds of the student councils and pays them out upon request.

Education Policy

Our task is to represent your interests both within the university and externally. We work closely with student representatives from other universities and critically monitor political developments outside the university. At the same time, we represent you in internal committees, raise your concerns, and ensure that your voice is heard.

In doing so, we always pay attention to what is changing, where different interests exist, and how we can work together to bring about change.

Networking is particularly important to us – both with allies whose interests overlap with yours and with the student councils and committees within the university. The "Landes-ASten-Konferenz" (LAK) in Hessen offers a platform for the most extensive cooperation between student bodies.

A central focus of our work is the organization of events that contribute to raising awareness of current and historical social, cultural, and political issues. We pay particular attention to the following topics:

- Democracy and fundamental rights
- Gender politics
- Anti-fascism/anti-racism
- Labor and social affairs

Together, we strive to be a strong voice for your interests and to bring about positive change both internally and externally.

Political education

Our university is a political place where ideas, attitudes and diverse life experiences come together. As the Department of Political Education, we ensure that this diversity is visible, that debates are conducted fairly and that every voice counts. We are committed to equality and oppose all forms of discrimination - regardless of background, religion, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, appearance or disability. We defend freedom of expression and religion, human rights and the constitutional order. We remain politically neutral, but never neutral in the face of injustice, hatred or incitement.



Student Parliament

The Student Parliament (StuPa) is the body elected by all students to represent their interests. It is the legislative body of the student body, i.e., the small Bundestag for all students. Here in the StuPa, you can make a big difference and help shape everyday student life at the university. You will also get to know lots of great people from other degree programs, committees, and other areas of the university.

But what exactly does the StuPa do?

The StuPa is the highest decision-making body of the student body. We decide how money is spent on student parties, whether the AStA gets money for a sound system, or how part of the semester fee is used for collaborations with transportation providers such as nextbike. We are the central representative body for students at the university, and every student can submit a proposal to us. Do you already have a project idea? You can find out how to submit a proposal and what you need to bear in mind on the AStA website, but the staff at the AStA office can also help you with this.

The StuPa has a presidium, a president, and two vice presidents, who are elected internally and are responsible for coordination.

The StuPa approves the budget presented by the AStA and can decide how the AStA will be structured for the next year and what funds the student councils will receive for self-administration. Once a year, in December, the 15 voting members of the student parliament are elected. Their term of office always begins in the following April and lasts for one year. Any student can stand for election. Experience has shown that they meet approximately every two weeks for public meetings. Everyone is welcome to attend and express their opinion.

Student councils

Universities are usually divided into different departments. All students in a particular department, institute, or faculty form what is known as a student council. Accordingly, there are five such student councils at RheinMain University of Applied Sciences. The structure varies from university to university and depends on a number of factors, such as the courses offered and the number of students. The student councils are represented by the student council council. This consists of at least five and at most fifteen student representatives in each department and is elected at RheinMain University of Applied Sciences by direct election of the candidates. As with most committees at HSRM, the legislative period is one year. The student council (FSR) of a respective student body essentially has the task of representing the interests of the students in the department, whether it be networking parties or campus design. Committee election

Anyone who wants to have a say should vote or run for office themselves.






Finance

Jobs, BAföG, scholarships: there are many ways to supplement your budget. If you plan to work during your studies, there are a few things to keep in mind. For example, you can only earn a certain amount tax-free per month, and as a full-time student, you are also limited in the number of hours you can work. In this chapter, you will learn about the regulations and which types of employment contracts are appropriate in different situations.

You may also be eligible for BAföG funding to cover your basic expenses. For students in financial need, there are also various options for financing their studies.

One topic that is often overlooked is health insurance for students. In addition to family insurance, which most students under the age of 25 are likely to have, there are other types of insurance available. It is worth finding out which one is best for you.

Some students can also receive financial support in the form of scholarships. We have compiled a list of many contact points and scholarships so that you can consider whether you would like to apply for a scholarship. This is particularly interesting for students who want to finance a stay abroad in this way.

Study financing

Studying is expensive. Students have various options for financing their studies. Those who do not receive a scholarship can borrow money from their parents or through part-time jobs, or they can take out various loans or apply for interest-free, partially interest-bearing, or fully interest-bearing loans under the Federal Training Assistance Act. There are many different options for financing your studies with loans. Every student should obtain comprehensive information about the options and obligations associated with each type of financing before deciding on a type of financing. However, most of them require one thing: a willingness to take on a certain amount of debt. This is because only very few loans are paid as interest-free loans or grants. No matter what you ultimately decide, you should carefully review all offers. You can also find more information about student loans and grants on the internet, at consumer advice centers, or from the advisors at your university and your student union.

Employment contracts

Every employment relationship is established in the form of an employment contract, and there are a few things to keep in mind, especially for shorterterm employment relationships: according to the "Nachweisgesetz" (German Employment Evidence Act), everyone has the right to be informed of the essential terms of the contract no later than one month after the start of the employment relationship. These include the amount of remuneration, working hours, a general description of the job, references to collective agreements and works agreements, the duration of employment, notice periods, and the place of work. At the beginning of the employment relationship, you should insist on a written employment contract that specifies the essential terms of the contract, because disputes about salary levels, tasks, notice periods, and similar issues arise time and again, and you often "lose out" even when you go to the labor court because there is no written documentation.

Financial aid for students

- 1. Students with children or pregnant students may be eligible for benefits under SBG II (Social Security Act II).
- 2. Check your eligibility for housing allowance, which may also be compatible with BAföG (Federal Education and Training Assistance Act).
- 3. In some cases, the "Wiesbadener Tafel" food bank is also accessible to students. Contact the AStA's social and financial counseling service.
- 4. Foreign students may also be entitled to BAföG in some cases.
- 5. More students are entitled to BAföG thanks to the packages that have recently been approved.

- 7. Initial information about the KfW student loan is available from your student services organization.
- 8. The student services organization offers the interest-free MainSWerk student loan.

Scholarships

General scholarships

Scholarships are available from various organizations and for "particularly gifted" students (the definition depends on the respective organization). In most cases, a certain level of commitment to social, political, and/or societal issues is required. In principle, most foundations provide funding at the BAföG rate (unlike BAföG, the scholarship does not have to be repaid later). In addition, there is occasionally "idealistic" support in the form of book allowances and offers to participate in special events.

Scholarships for studying abroad

The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) supports students worldwide in education, training, and research in all disciplines. Applications are usually submitted in your home country via the DAAD office or the German Embassy. The International Office (AAA) can tell you under what conditions you can still submit applications after your arrival. Most of the foundations and institutions listed here offer funding for studying abroad in line with the BAföG regulations, but there are exceptions. BAföG itself also provides funding for studying abroad. In addition, there are other scholarships for a semester abroad, such as Promos. WBS students can also apply for the Richard Müller Foundation's internal scholarship.

Bafög

BAföG is the abbreviation for the Federal Training Assistance Act, which regulates state support for the education of school pupils and students in Germany.

Requirements

Anyone who has not yet reached the age of 30 at the start of their training, is a German citizen or relative of a German citizen (exceptions possible), and is completing their first training course that is eligible for funding under the BAföG Act (exceptions possible, e.g., for second and third courses of study) can apply for BAföG. educational pathways).

Amount of the sum

The amount of financial aid is calculated individually for each student. It is based on the student's own income or that of their parents and/or spouse, as well as the amount of savings/assets they have. The amount of support for all those who have been granted entitlement is up to 992€ per month, depending on "need."

Funding period

The maximum funding period is based on the standard period of study, but may be extended in certain cases (e.g., pregnancy, childcare, committee work, illness) upon request.

Costs, repayment terms

Study BAföG is usually granted half as a grant and half as an interest-free loan. The maximum loan amount to be repaid is €10,010. Repayment of the loan begins 5 years after the end of the maximum funding period (not after the end of the course of study). The loan is repaid in regular installments of €130 per month over a period of up to 20 years. Three monthly installments are combined into a quarterly amount. Anyone who repays the loan in full or in part before it is due will have part of the debt waived.

Interesting facts

After the fourth semester, proof of academic achievement is required. Each BAföG recipient is currently allowed to earn up to €1,500 in twelve months during the approval period Earn an additional 6,672€ or 556€ per month without it affecting your benefits. Please note: Certain scholarships are counted toward the BAföG rate! Further assistance is available from the AStA's social services department.

Casual work

Basic contribution

The basic allowance is 12,096€ per year plus 1.230 € Flat-rate advertising allowance. Anything above this amount is taxable. Supplements for actual night, Sunday, and holiday work are not subject to income tax.

For single parents

There are additional allowances for single parents who live alone with their children, for example. The relief allowance for single parents (EfA) is 4,260€ per year and child. For each additional child, the amount increases by the EfA plus 240€.

BAFÖG deductions

In order to avoid any deductions from BAföG funding, only 6,672€ per year, equivalent to approximately 556€ per month, may be earned in additional income. This amount is independent of the actual BAföG grant. The legislator assumes that your parents will supplement the actual amount up to the maximum rate. Income earned during initial training is no longer taken into account for child benefit purposes.

Short-term employment

Within a 12-month period, you may work for a maximum of three months or 70 working days as part of a "short-term employment" arrangement. The amount of your income is irrelevant (except in relation to the basic allowance). This job is not subject to social security contributions, nor is it counted towards any existing 556€ job you may already have. You are liable for tax, but you can claim back the tax you have paid as part of an annual income tax adjustment. To do this, however, you must file a tax return.

Mini-job

A marginal employment relationship is a job with a regular maximum monthly income of 556€. There are no taxes, and you can be exempted from social security contributions. In the commercial sector, the employer pays a lump sum to the "Minijob-Zentrale" (mini-job center). If the total income does not exceed 556€, several mini-jobs can be combined. If two jobs that are not subject to social security contributions exceed the 556€ limit in total, both jobs become subject to social security contributions. However, you are allowed to have another job as a mini-job in addition to a job that is subject to social security contributions.



Casual work

Working student regulations

If the income exceeds €556 or the employment exceeds short-term employment, only pension insurance contributions must be paid as long as the weekly working hours are less than 20 hours.

Exceptions

If you work in the evenings, at night, or mainly on weekends, the number of hours may be exceeded if your studies are your primary focus. If you have had several fixed-term employment contracts (each lasting less than two months) within a year that involved more than 20 hours of work per week, these are also exempt from insurance if they fall within the lecture period. However, the total number of weeks (182 calendar days) per year in which the student works more than 20 hours per week may not exceed 26. The annual period is calculated retrospectively from the end of the employment to be assessed. During the lecture-free period, students may work more than 20 hours per week if they do not exceed 26 weeks per year. During a leave of absence/part-time studies/distance learning/after the thesis, among other things, the working student regulation cannot usually be applied.

Midi-jobs

An income between 556,01€ and 2,000€ (sliding scale) is considered a midi job. In this case, social security contributions increase linearly as income rises. Full contributions are only payable on incomes above 2.000€.

Fee and service contracts

Students can also earn money in a non-contractual form: a fee contract can only be concluded between you as a sole trader or freelancer and a company. This means that you are working as a self-employed person. In other words, you are not employed as an employee with an employment contract and the provisions it contains regarding vacation, protection against dismissal, continued payment of remuneration in the event of illness, and so on.

The following applies to fee-based contracts and contracts for work:

The client also does not pay any social security contributions. You are responsible for your own health insurance and payments in old age. The fee agreement initially only obliges the client to pay a fee. In this respect, the basis for the fee agreement can also be a contract for work. The client undertakes to pay a fee for the creation of the work. This is due after acceptance of the work. With a contract for work, you bear the risk of actually achieving the agreed result. Unfortunately, you are not entitled to vacation pay or sick pay. Fees and contract terms must be negotiated yourself.

Health insurance



Family insurance

Students can remain covered by their parents' insurance until they reach the age of 25. Exceptions: If you are completing federal voluntary service or a voluntary social year (FSJ) under the age of 25, family insurance will continue to cover you beyond the age of 25 for the corresponding period.

Married students are also covered by family insurance, provided that their spouse is not a student and is a member of a statutory health insurance scheme. However, one condition for family insurance is that you may not earn more than 535€ (e.g., from self-employment) or 556€ from a minijob. If the requirements for family insurance are met, it takes precedence over compulsory student insurance and voluntary compulsory insurance.

Compulsory student insurance

If the requirements for family insurance no longer apply (you are over 25 years of age or earn more than 556€ per month), compulsory student insurance applies, which currently costs around 120€ per month. The basic principle here is that compulsory insurance for students only applies if the focus is on studying and not on gainful employment. Specifically, this means that you may not work more than 20 hours per week. If you regularly work 20 hours or more per week, you will lose your student status for insurance purposes.

In exceptional cases, it is possible to work 20 hours or more if the hours are worked on weekends or in

the evenings. Even if the 20-hour limit is exceeded during the lecture-free period, your studies still take precedence. The working time of 20 hours per week may be exceeded in a maximum of 26 weeks per year. However, such exceptional cases should always be clarified on a case-by-case basis. The insurance obligation ends for students at the end of the 14th semester and/or when they reach the age of 30. After that, you should take out voluntary compulsory insurance.

Voluntary statutory insurance

Voluntary compulsory insurance applies to students who do not meet the requirements for family insurance or compulsory student insurance, e.g., if you are 30 or older or have exceeded the 14th semester. The contribution is calculated based on your monthly income, with a minimum contribution of around 182€. You can find more information at: finanztip.de/qkv/freiwillig-versichert/

Private insurance

One reason for taking out private insurance could be that you are eligible for private insurance through your parents. To do this, you must first be exempted from compulsory insurance.

You can only be exempted from compulsory insurance within the first three months after enrollment (or three months after the end of family insurance). This decision is irrevocable and cannot be changed during your studies. However, even after your studies, there may be problems with re-entering the statutory health insurance system, especially if you become self-employed. Therefore, consider the advantages and disadvantages of statutory or private health insurance during and after your studies. If your parents are civil servants, the allowance is linked to their child benefit entitlement. If you are still studying at the age of 25 or if you earn so much in part-time jobs that you are no longer eligible for child benefit, you will no longer receive a subsidy for medical expenses from the state. If you want to take out private insurance without a subsidy, you should bear in mind that you will probably pay higher premiums than you would for compulsory statutory student insurance.

Housing

Rent

Most landlords will present you with a standard rental agreement (e.g., from the Haus und Grundbesitzverein). If the landlord presents you with their own (or modified) rental agreement, caution is advised in any case. You should read the agreement carefully. If you are unsure about the meaning of parts of the agreement, you should seek expert advice. Only sign the agreement once you are sure that none of the clauses could be detrimental to you.

You should exercise caution with graduated rents (rent increases that are specified in the lease agreement), fixed-term leases (where you are bound to the agreement for a fixed period and cannot terminate it early), and taking over apartment inventory (be careful not to end up with bulky waste).

Record all agreements and arrangements with the landlord in writing. Verbal agreements are also legally binding, but in case of doubt, they are much more difficult to enforce. When you move in, draw up a handover report. Record all visible defects (damp, stains on the carpet or wallpaper, etc.) and

the condition of the apartment (has it been renovated? If so, when?) in writing. Ask to see the utility bills for the previous year so that you don't end up with high additional payments.

The advance payment amount may differ significantly from the actual additional costs. Make a note of exactly what damage (if any) is to be repaired by the landlord and by when. The deadline should be clearly noted and, in case of doubt, compliance with it should be demanded. Just in case, you should take someone with you who can act as a witness. The landlord should also provide you with a copy of the rental agreement and any additional agreements.

The International Office is the central hub for international relations at Hochschule RheinMain. We guide and assist international students, refugees, and exchange students, and we coordinate our university's global partnerships.

We're here to help you explore opportunities to gain international experience during your studies. For some students, completing a semester of study or an internship abroad is mandatory and already scheduled in their curriculum. For voluntary stays abroad – whether for study, an internship, or a summer course – you will need to determine the best timing during your degree program and ensure which courses will be recognized.

Whether you are planning a required semester abroad or a voluntary international adventure, it's important to start planning early. Language preparation is particularly important, as most programs require a certain level of language proficiency. Ideally, you should begin preparing one to two years in advance. Stays abroad and even the entire period of study abroad can be funded by BAföG. One prerequisite is that the institution where you are spending your semester abroad is equivalent to your German educational institution. In addition, the stay must last at least 6 months or one semester. For cooperation partners of the university, funding is possible for stays of 12 weeks or more. Outside the EU, at least part of the study abroad must be creditable toward your degree; the funding period is generally limited to one year. A complete degree

program is only funded by BAföG within the EU or in Switzerland. You also have the option of writing your thesis abroad. You can find the relevant information under the keyword "Inlands-BAföG" (domestic BAföG). An internship abroad is funded if it is a mandatory internship lasting at least 12 weeks.

Important to know

HDS user recognition

The HDS-ID is a personalized user ID for members of the RheinMain University of Applied Sciences. The information required for the HDS account is collected and managed by Service Management staff and generated in the central directory service. All members of the university receive a letter with their access data. Please keep this letter in a safe place! You can use the master password contained in the letter to reset any forgotten passwords at any time. The ID allows access to the central services/systems of RheinMain University of Applied Sciences (authentication and authorization):

- Authorization to use email services
- Authorization to use Wi-Fi, VPN, and Eduroam services
- Authorization to log in to computers
- Authorization to use the campus management system and the learning management system

HSRM Compass compass.hs-rm.de

You are probably already familiar with this portal from your application. It is the university's campus management system and, in addition to applications, is also used to manage your studies and exams. Here you can log in with your HDS user ID and manage your data, download your enrollment, study progress, and BAföG certificates, collection slips, and exam certificates. You will also find out-

standing and completed payments to the university here, e.g., the semester fee, which is due each semester as re-registration. Exam management and exam registration and deregistration are also located here.

Stud.IP

studip.hs-rm.de

Stud.IP is the university's online platform. All students, professors, and lecturers have an account here. It is a learning management system for creating and administering web-based learning environments. It allows courses, research groups, or committees to be assigned a digital equivalent in the form of so-called events and to be managed online. With your HDS user ID, you automatically have access to Stud.IP. You should have received this information by mail. Before logging into Stud. IP for the first time, you must activate your online access at hds.hs-rm.de/aktivieren/index.php. It can take up to 60 minutes for the data to be transferred to the system.

E-Mail and Webmail

As a student at RheinMain University of Applied Sciences, you automatically have a student email account. The central email system allows uniform access via smartphone, tablet, computer, or web-

mail, for example, so you can work productively and manage your emails, contacts, tasks, and appointments from virtually anywhere. Instructions for installing the mailbox on your smartphone or laptop can be found at: hs-rm.de/itmz

VPN

Regardless of where in the world you are and which service provider you use to connect to the internet, you can establish a secure connection to the university network via our VPN service. Your data is transmitted from your computer to the VPN server via an encrypted connection through the network. Instructions for setting up the VPN client can be found at the ITMZ:

The ITMZ coordinates and provides various WLANs:

- CampusWLAN (provision of a campus-wide WLAN)
- Eduroam (provision of a cross-university WLAN, also accessible at other universities)
- GuestWLAN (provision of a temporary WLAN for guests attending events, set up by responsible persons within the departments and divisions).

Within the Research & Teaching user group, institutions worldwide can use Eduroam. RheinMain University of Applied Sciences has been participating in DFN Roaming since June 2008. This enables HSRM members to use the WLAN of other institutions participating in DFN Roaming. Instructions for setup for all common operating systems can also be found at the ITMZ.
